

The Pupil Premium (PP) 2016-2017 review

The Pupil Premium is additional funding the Government allocates to schools to support children eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) and Looked after Children (LAC). The funding is used to ensure that these students close the gap on their non-FSM/LAC peers in terms of attainment and progress.

Students are defined as FSM if they have been eligible for free school meals at anytime during Year 6 to Year 11 ('Ever6'). Even though a student may have been eligible in Year 6 and not afterwards, that student will count as an FSM student in the school's performance tables once they have left school.

In January 2015 Alder Community High School received a National Pupil Premium Award in recognition of the progress of disadvantaged students in our care from 2011 to 2014.

In the financial year 2016/2017 Alder Community High school received £210,822.

In the academic Year 2016/2017 there were 40 students in Year 11 who were eligible for the Pupil Premium.
