In 2015/2016 we received £7,500 for students who were not at level 4 at the end of Key Stage 2 in English and/or Maths.

### **Interventions during the academic year 2015-16:**

- English Intervention programme: students complete an extra five lessons of Literacy a week.

- 'Grammar for Writing' programme aimed at improving students' grammar.
- Small-group literacy intervention delivered through the school's Learning Support Centre
- Dedicated 1:1 additional teaching-staff support delivered through the school's Learning Support Centre (specific students only)
- Weekly 1:1 literacy intervention delivered through the school's Learning Support Centre (specific students only)
- Social Communications support group (specific students only)
- Additional TA support in both the classroom and small-group/1:1 intervention
- Summer school - a week spent at Manchester City Football Club whereby students were engaged in literacy and numeracy activities.
